Learn Welsh courses are available at different levels, which correspond to the learning levels of the Common European Framework.

The emphasis on all levels is on speaking and enjoying the language.

Name of level	Description	Learning levels of the Common European Framework	Recommended minimum number of contact hours
Entry	Courses for beginners, helping you to learn about the present, the past and the future.	A1	120
Foundation	This level requires some experience of Welsh. There will be opportunities to discuss everyday subjects such as family and friends, work and interests.	A2	120
Intermediate	This level is suitable for those who are familiar with the main patterns of Welsh. There are opportunities to develop conversational skills, with a little more writing, reading and listening.	B1	120
Advanced	This is an opportunity to discuss all kinds of subjects and themes. Learners also develop their reading, writing and listening skills. The main aim is to enable learners to become confident speakers.	B2	360
Gloywi (Proficiency)	Proficiency courses, suitable for fluent learners and first language speakers, are tailored to the needs of the class. The aim in general is to further develop skills confidence.



The Government set the following core outcomes for the Centre:

- ▶ Be a visible institution setting a national strategic direction for the Learn Welsh sector.
- ▶ Provide leadership for the Learn Welsh course providers.
- ▶ Raise standards in teaching and learning in the Learn Welsh sector.
- ▶ Develop a high quality, appropriate and engaging national curriculum, and produce resources suitable for a range of learners.

- ▶ **Attract:** Open doors to learning Welsh and attract more learners.
- ▶ **Learn:** Provide a variety of high quality learning opportunities.

Increasing opportunities for people to learn and enjoy our language - that is the priority for the National Centre for Learning Welsh as it embarks on a new chapter, following the Welsh Government's decision to extend its contract to 2027.

From September 2022, the Centre will introduce two new initiatives. There will be free provision for 16-25 year-olds, and a programme of training for the education workforce delivered free of charge, in co-operation with a network of partners.

The Centre continues to offer a wide variety of learning programmes. There are opportunities for self-study and face-to-face and virtual classes, available in the daytime and evenings, in workplaces and in the community. Other projects target specific groups, including healthcare workers and families.

During the year, the relationships with SaySomethinginWelsh and with Duolingo were strengthened, to provide opportunities for our learners to practise their Welsh outside the class. A new, exciting partnership is being developed with the Football Association of Wales to attract new learners in response to Wales qualifying for the Football World Cup.

As the Centre embraces the opportunities that come its way, I would like to extend my thanks to the central staff team under the leadership of Efa Gruffudd Jones for their initiative and enthusiasm, and to our providers for their work. Thank you, also, to my fellow members on the Board of Directors and to the chair of the Centre's Advisory Board, Rheon Tomos, and all its members, for their continuing support.

Mae'r Gymraeg yn perthyn i ni i gyd, ac mae wedi bod yn faint i arwain y Ganolfan Genedlaethol dros y flwyddyn ddiwethaf wrth i ni weithredu cynlluniau sy'n croesawu pobl o bob cefndir.

Edrychwn ymlaen at groesawu mwy o bobl ifanc yn yr hydref, wrth i ni gynnal cyrsiau rhithiol penodol ar gyfer y grŵp oedran 18-25 oed, fel rhan o'n cynllun pellgyrhaeddol i gynyddu sgiliau Cymraeg ymyst pobl ifanc. 'Ymlaen gyda'r Dysgu'.

Mae'r prosiect 'Croeso i Bawb' yn mynd o nerth i nerth, gydag adnoddau ar gyfer pobl nad yw'r Saesneg yn iaith gyntaf iddynt neu nad ydynt yn siarad llawer o Saesneg wedi eu datblygu. Mae cyrsiau hunan-astudio byrion trwy gyfrwng Wcreineg, Arabeg Syria, Farsi, Pashto a Chantoneg, a chyrsiau SaySomethinginWelsh trwy gyfrwng Pashto, Dari ac Arabeg wedi'u comisiynu.

Mae lleoli tiwtoriaid mewn ysgolion er mwyn gwneud dysgu'r Gymraeg i rieni yn hwylus yn fenter gyffrous arall, sy'n perthyn i'n cynllun 'Cymraeg yn y Cartref'. Mae sesiynau Clwb Cwtsh, cyrsiau cymunedol, ac adnoddau

'Siarad Babi', a ddatblygwyd ar y cyd â'n partner, Mudiad Meithrin, hefyd yn rhan o'r cynllun.

Erbyn hyn mae dros 1,500 o gyflogwyr yn rhan o'n prosiect 'Cymraeg Gwaith', sy'n cynnig cyfleoedd hyblyg i ddysgu'r Gymraeg yn y gweithle. Datblygwyd porth ar-lein newydd ar gyfer y gweithlu addysg, hefyd, sy'n cyflwyno'r holl ddewisiadau dysgu-am-ddim i'r garfan honno.

Trwy barhau i arloesi a sicrhau darpariaeth amrywiol, 'dyn ni'n gallu gwreddu ein huchelgais o ddenu dysgwyr newydd a sicrhau cyfleoedd i'n dysgwyr fwynhau eu Cymraeg.

Wrth i ni roi'r cynlluniau hyn ar waith, mae cadw dysgwyr wrth galon ein gweithgareddau yn hollbwysig, ac mae'n dda gen i adrodd ar ganlyniadau cadarnhaol ein holiadur blynnyddol. Fe ddywedodd 99% o'r ymatebwyr eu bod yn mwynhau dysgu Cymraeg, gyda 70% yn nodi eu bod yn mwynhau'n 'fawr iawn'. Dyma'r ffigwr uchaf erioed.

Hoffwn ddiolch yn ddiffuant i'm cydweithwyr ac i staff y sector Dysgu Cymraeg am eu gwaith a'u brwdrydedd, a dymuno'n dda iawn i'n holl ddysgwyr.

Cymraeg belongs to us all, and it has been a privilege to lead the National Centre over the last year as we put into action plans that welcome people from all backgrounds.

We look forward to welcoming more young people in the autumn, as we deliver online courses specifically for the 18-25 age group, as part of our far-reaching scheme to increase Welsh language skills among young people.

The 'Croeso i Bawb' (all are welcome) project is going from strength to strength, with resources developed for people whose first language is not English, or who do not speak English fluently. Short courses have been commissioned for self-study through the medium of Ukrainian, Syrian Arabic, Farsi, Pashto and Cantonese, as well as SaySomethinginWelsh courses through the medium of Pashto, Dari and Arabic.

Tutor placements within schools to facilitate learning Welsh for parents is another exciting initiative which is part of the 'Welsh at Home' scheme. Clwb Cwtsh sessions, community

courses and 'Siarad Babi' (Parentese) resources, developed in collaboration with our partner, Mudiad Meithrin, are also part of the scheme.

Over 1,500 employers are now part of our 'Work Welsh' scheme, which provides flexible opportunities to learn Welsh in the workplace. A new online portal has also been developed for the education workforce, showing all the options for free learning available to this sector.

Through our continued innovation and delivery of a wide range of provision, we can realise our ambition of attracting new learners and ensuring our learners have opportunities to enjoy their Welsh.

As we deliver these plans, it is vital we keep our learners at the heart of all that we do, and I am pleased to report the outcomes of our annual survey. 99% of respondents said they enjoyed learning Welsh, with 70% saying they enjoyed 'very much'. This is the highest ever figure.

I would like to sincerely thank my colleagues and staff in the Learn Welsh sector for their work and enthusiasm, and to extend my best wishes to all our learners.

Tiwtoriaid Yfory Tutors of Tomorrow

In July, 13 young people were welcomed to Cardiff where they spent two weeks as part of the National Centre's Tiwtoriaid Yfory scheme.

The aim was to encourage more young people to work in the Learn Welsh sector, and to introduce them to the possibility of securing a career in education. Many of them have already progressed to work as tutors.

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Macsen Llewelyn Brown said:

"I was glad of the opportunity to observe Welsh classes and to see how professional tutors carry out their work. I will be going abroad for a year, but I would love to have the opportunity to teach a virtual class, so that I can put the new skills I have learned into use."

Cai Thomas said:

"I had a constructive fortnight in the company of the young people and was inspired by the Centre's current tutors. My favourite part was observing and taking part in the Entry-level classes. I learnt a lot by seeing how a tutor teaches new skills, but does so whilst having fun too."

Esyllt Einion added:

"Through the lively training sessions and the opportunities to observe classes, the course has given me the confidence and skills that are needed to be a Learn Welsh tutor. I enjoyed learning more about the education sector more generally, and hearing about the experiences of guest speakers from the field of education in Wales."

Denu: agor drysau i ddysgu'r Gymraeg

Adnabod y gynulleidfa

Cynhaliwyd prosiect gyda chwmni Beaufort i adnabod rhesymau pobl dros ddysgu Cymraeg ac agweddau at y Gymraeg. Cadarnhaodd y prosiect bod rhesymau amrywiol gyda phobl dros ddysgu, gyda chryfhau sgiliau yn brif reswm ymhliith y to ifanc.

Cynhaliwyd holiadur gyda dysgwyr ifanc cyfredol y Ganolfan a arweiniodd at gynnal Grŵp Ffocws Pobl Ifanc. Mae'r data a'r dystiolaeth a gasglwyd o ganlyniad i'r prosiectau hyn wedi dylanwadu ar yr ymgyrchoedd a'r ddarpariaeth sy ar gael.

Recriwtio

Ers dechrau'r pandemig mae'r Ganolfan Genedlaethol wedi canolbwytio ar farchnata digidol fel ffordd o ddenu dysgwyr newydd. Yn ystod y flwyddyn ddiwethaf, cynhaliwyd ymgyrchoedd helaeth ar Facebook a Google Search, i ddenu dysgwyr newydd i gyrsiau Ionawr 2022 ac i gyrsiau byrion hunan-astudio y cynllun Cymraeg Gwaith. Recordiwyd

hysbysebion sain a ddarlledwyd ar wahanol orsafoedd radio a phodlediadau.

Rhannwyd ymgyrch haf 2022 yn ddwy ran, gyda gweithgareddau i ddenu dysgwyr newydd i gyrsiau Mynediad mis Medi, a gweithgareddau i reciriwtio dysgwyr 18-25 oed. Fe gydweliethiodd y Ganolfan gyda dylanwadwyr ar TikTok ac Instagram ar gyfer yr ymgyrch pobl ifanc.

Cynhyrchwyd pecynnau adnoddau digidol ar gyfer darparwyr cyrsiau'r Ganolfan, i'w defnyddio'n lleol, gan gynnwys deunyddiau 'Cyw Cynnar', sef cynnig gostyngiad i bob dysgwr cyfredol.

Fe ddechreuodd ambell i ddarparwr gynnal gweithgareddau marchnata stryd, a chynhyrchwyd cylchgrawn 'Hwyl yr Haf' i gefnogi'r gwaith hwnnw; nod y cylchgrawn, hefyd, yw rhoi hwb i ddysgwyr cyfredol i ddal ati dros y gwyliau.

Strategic objective 1

Attract: opening doors to learning Welsh

Getting to know the audience

A project was undertaken with Beaufort Research to identify people's reasons for learning Welsh and attitudes towards the Welsh language. The project confirmed that people have a range of reasons for learning, with improving skills the main reason among the younger generation.

A survey was conducted with the Centre's current young learners which led to a Focus Group for Young People. The data and evidence gathered as a result of these projects have informed our campaigns and the provision on offer.

Recruitment

Since the onset of the pandemic, the National Centre has focused on digital marketing as a means of attracting new learners. Over the past year, extensive campaigns were conducted on Facebook and Google Search, to attract new learners to courses in January 2022 and to short

self-study courses on the Work Welsh scheme. Audio advertisements were recorded and broadcast on various radio stations and podcasts.

The summer 2022 campaign was divided into two parts, including activities to attract new learners to Entry courses for September, and activities aimed at recruiting 18-25 year-old learners. The Centre worked with influencers on TikTok and Instagram for the young learners' campaign.

Digital resource packs were created for the Centre's course providers for local use, including 'Early Bird' materials, which were centred on offering a discount to all current learners.

Some providers started to hold street marketing activities, and a magazine entitled 'Hwyl yr Haf' (summer fun) was produced to support this work; the magazine also aims to encourage current learners to enjoy using their Welsh over the holidays.



Inspiring others

Data

Mae data'r sector Dysgu Cymraeg yn cael eu rheoli gan y Ganolfan Dysgu Cymraeg Genedlaethol.

Mae cronfa ddata ganolog yn casglu gwybodaeth gan bob dysgwr wrth iddynt gofrestru ar gwrs. Y data diweddaraf sy ar gael yw'r data ar gyfer y flwyddyn academaidd **2020-2021**.

Mae data 2020-2021 yn cynnwys gweithgaredd y sector yn ystod cyfnod y pandemig. Effeithiwyd ar weithgaredd y sector wrth i ddysgu wyneb-yn-wyneb ddod i ben ym Mawrth 2020. Mae hyn wedi ei adlewyrchu yn rhannol yn nata 2019-2020 ac yn rhannol yn nata 2020-2021.

Data

The Learn Welsh sector's data is managed by the National Centre for Learning Welsh.

A central database gathers information from all learners as they enrol on a course. The latest available data is for the **2020-2021** academic year.

The 2020-2021 data includes activity during the pandemic period. The activity of the sector was affected by the end of face-to-face learning during March 2020. This is partly reflected in the 2019-2020 data and partly in the 2020-2021 data.

Funding for the Centre's Work Welsh scheme was reduced in April 2020. As a result, it has not been possible to offer intensive courses at all levels but the choice of self-study courses at Entry level has been increased. The reduction to the scheme's funding continued until the end of March 2021, and so data from 1 August 2020 to 31 July 2021 was affected.

Looking at the data for the past few years, it is encouraging to see a gradual increase in the numbers learning Welsh. Over the same period, a substantial increase is shown in the number of learning activities.



Number of unique learners 2020-2021

The 'number of unique learners' counts every learner only once, regardless of the number of courses they have attended during the year.

The 2020-2021 data, compared with the 2019-2020 data shows more learners learning at higher levels.

The lower numbers in 2020-2021 reflect the decrease in the number of learners following self-study courses at Entry level.

Number of learning activities 2020-2021

Learners can attend more than one learning activity at various levels and intensities during the year. For example, a single learner can attend a 170-259 hour course at Entry level as well as a course such as a 'Sadwrn Siarad' (Saturday workshop) during the period in question. This is considered as two learning activities.

The **2020-2021** learners participated in **29,175** learning activities, a decrease of 3% compared to 2019-2020. Individual learners have participated in more learning activities per head during **2020-2021**, and have therefore been learning more intensively than in **2019-2020**.

Er mwyn cyfrannu at gynyddu sgiliau Cymraeg ymysg pobl ifanc, sefydlwyd cynllun newydd o'r enw 'Ymlaen gyda'r Dysgu' yn 2021 i ddatblygu partneriaethau gyda'r sectorau addysg statudol ac anstatudol.

Cyflwynwyd cwrs hunan-astudio ar gyfer is-raddedigion a chwrs hunan-astudio wedi ei deilwra ar gyfer athrawon. Cynhaliwyd cynllun peilot gyda'r sector Addysg Bellach i adnabod anghenion myfyrwyr a chynhaliwyd ymchwil gyda CBAC i adnabod anghenion dysgwyr ôl-statudol a'u lleoli yn y ddarpariaeth Dysgu Cymraeg.

Arweiniodd y gwaith hwn at gynllun 'Ymlaen gyda'r Dysgu 2022+', sy hefyd yn ymateb i ofynion Llywodraeth Cymru i ddarparu cyfleoedd Dysgu Cymraeg am ddim i bobl 16-25 oed o fis Medi 2022. Mewn partneriaeth gyda SaySomethinginWelsh, bydd offeryn digidol ar gael i helpu ceiswyr lloches a ffoaduriaid i ddysgu Cymraeg llafar trwy gyfrwng ieithoedd Arabeg, Pashto a Dari.

Cyrsiau cyfunol

Mae cyrsiau cyfunol yn cyfuno gwaith hunan-astudio ar-lein gyda gwers gyda thiwtor. Mae'r cyrsiau hyn, sy'n ddelfrydol i'r dysgwyr hynny sy eisiau dysgu yn gyflym, yn parhau i gael eu datblygu. Erbyn hyn, mae darpariaeth ar lefelau Mynediad, Sylfaen a Chanolradd ar gael.

Cyrsiau hunan-astudio lefel gyfan

Erbyn hyn, mae cyrsiau ar lefelau Mynediad, Sylfaen a Chanolradd ar gael.

Mae adborth yn dangos bod dysgwyr yn eu mwynhau gan eu bod yn caniatáu iddynt ddysgu ar eu cyflymder eu hunain, ac mae'r cyrsiau yn boblogaidd gyda phobl sy'n gweithio shifft - carfan anodd ei chyrraedd yn draddodiadol.

Cyrsiau hunan-astudio byrion

Strategic objective 2

Learn: provide excellent Learn Welsh services for all


Ymlaen gyda'r Dysgu

To contribute towards increasing Welsh language skills among young people, a new scheme called 'Ymlaen gyda'r Dysgu' was set up in 2021 to develop partnerships with the statutory and non-statutory education sectors.

A self-study course for undergraduates was introduced, and a bespoke self-study course for teachers. A pilot scheme was undertaken with the Further Education sector to identify students' needs and research was undertaken by the WJEC to identify the needs of post-statutory learners and to place them in the Learn Welsh provision.

This work led to the 'Ymlaen gyda'r Dysgu 2022+' scheme, which also meets the Welsh Government's requirements for Learn Welsh opportunities to be provided free of charge for 16-25 year-olds from September 2022. The revised scheme includes specific virtual courses at Entry and Foundation levels for 18-25 year-olds, with an option to learn intensively by following a blended learning course. These courses will begin in autumn 2022.

Croeso i Bawb



For some years, the Centre has been developing work to welcome people whose first language is not English, or who do not speak English fluently. A specific taster course, *Croeso i Bawb* (all are welcome), was created and is now being adapted as a self-study course.

In addition, to present important aspects of modern Wales, 'welcome' units were commissioned in five languages: Cantonese, Syrian Arabic, Farsi, Pashto and Ukrainian.

In partnership with *SaySomethinginWelsh*, a digital tool will be available to help asylum-seekers and refugees to learn spoken Welsh through the medium of Arabic, Pashto and Dari.

Blended learning courses

Blended learning courses combine online self-study with tutor-led lessons. These courses are ideal for those learners who wish to learn quickly, and their development continues. So far, provision is available at Entry, Foundation and Intermediate levels.

Self-study 'complete level' courses

Self-study courses are available at Entry, Foundation and Intermediate levels.

Feedback suggests learners enjoy these courses as they enable them to learn at their own pace, and the courses are popular with shift workers - a group that has traditionally been hard to reach.

Short self-study courses

A brand new short course has been developed for youth workers. In addition, the 'Why Welsh' course was adapted for youth workers. Other new short courses, for the agriculture sector, the sports world, and the field of marketing and communication, were also introduced during the year.

Rhaglen barhaus

Fel rhan o'n rhaglen barhaus o wella ein cyrsiau, cyflwynwyd fersiwn newydd o'r cwrs Uwch 1, a chynhyrchwyd adnoddau newydd ar gyfer y cwrs Cymraeg yn y Cartref. Cynhyrchwyd gwersi cyfoes ar lefel Uwch ar amryw o themâu.

Camau

Erbyn hyn mae cyfres o gyrsiau hunan-astudio ar gael ar gyfer y gweithlu gofal ac addysg blynyddoedd cynnar, a'r sector chwarae. Mae'r cyrsiau yn rhai 20 awr, gyda hyd at 60 awr ar bob lefel. Byddai dysgu am 60 awr ar un lefel yn galluogi unigolion i gynyddu yn sylweddol eu sgiliau trosglwyddo iaith i blant ifanc.

Mae'r cyrsiau hefyd yn rhoi llwybr continwwm clir i'r gweithlu, a hynny am y tro cyntaf erioed.

Lansiwyd y cwrs cyntaf ym Mehefin 2021 gyda 400 yn cofrestru o fewn ychydig fisgoedd. Mae cwrs Mynediad a Sylfaen bellach ar gael, a rhan gyntaf cwrs Mynediad Chwarae.

Datblygu'r gweithlu Dysgu Cymraeg

Tiwtoriaid Yfory

Yn ystod mis Gorffennaf 2022, daeth criw o fyfyrwyr prifysgol at ei gilydd i gael hyfforddiant mewn dulliau Dysgu Cymraeg. Cafwyd cyfle i arsylwi dosbarthiadau Cwrs Haf Dysgu Cymraeg Caerdydd, a chafwyd siaradwyr i'w hysbrydoli a dangos yr holl gyfleoedd sy ar gael yn y gweithlu addysg yng Nghymru. Mae rhai eisoes wedi dechrau tiwtora, a hoffai'r Ganolfan ddiolch iddynt am eu brwd frydedd.

Academi

Nod rhaglen Academi yw rhoi cyfleoedd i holl staff y sector Dysgu Cymraeg i ddatblygu ystod eang o sgiliau a phrofiadau a magu hyder yn eu gwaith. Yn ystod 2021-2022, cyflwynwyd Academi ar-lein ar dysgucymraeg.cymru. Yma, ceir yr holl adnoddau ar gyfer tiwtoriaid ac mae hefyd yn blaftfform ar gyfer cofnodi hyfforddiant personol. Bydd cyfleoedd i fanteisio ar ystod o hyfforddiant, gan gynnwys gweithdai rhithiol a chyrsiau hunan-astudio.

Continuous programme

As part of our continuous programme to improve our courses, a new version of the Uwch 1 (Advanced 1) course was completed, and new resources were created for the Welsh at Home course. Contemporary lessons were created on a range of themes.

Camau – Early Years education and childcare sector scheme

A series of self-study courses are available for the Early Years education and childcare workforce, and in the play sector. These are 20-hour courses, with up to 60 hours available at each level. Learning for 60 hours on one level would enable individuals to substantially improve their skills in transferring the language to young children.

The courses also provide, for the first time, a clear pathway along a continuum.

The first course was launched in June 2021, and attracted 400 enrolments within a few months. Entry and Foundation level courses are now available, and the first part of an Entry course for Play.

Developing the Learn Welsh workforce

Tiwtoriaid Yfory/Tutors of Tomorrow

In July 2022, a group of university students came together to receive training on Learn Welsh methods. They were offered the opportunity to observe classes on the Learn Welsh Cardiff Summer Course, and were addressed by speakers who provided inspiration and highlighted all the opportunities available in the education workforce in Wales. Some have already progressed to work as tutors, and the Centre wishes to thank them for their enthusiasm.

Academi

The aim of the ‘Academi’ programme is to provide opportunities for all staff in the Learn Welsh sector to develop a wide range of skills and experiences and to enhance confidence in their work. During 2021-2022, Academi was set up online on learnwelsh.cymru. Here, all the resources for tutors are available, and it is also a platform for recording individual training. There will be opportunities to benefit from a range of training, including virtual workshops and self-study courses.

- ▶ Mewn partneriaeth â Mudiad Meithrin, casglwyd geirfa 'Siarad Babi', geirfa arbennig sy'n cael ei defnyddio gyda babis. Mae adnoddau wedi'u creu yn seiliedig ar yr eirfa, fydd yn cael eu dosbarthu trwy rwydweithiau'r Mudiad.

- ▶ Mae cronfa grant newydd wedi ei sefydlu i'n darparwyr allu cyflwyno cyrsiau Cymraeg yn y Cartref o fewn eu hardaloedd, mewn modd hyblyg a newydd.
- ▶ Yn dilyn llwyddiant sesiynau y Clwb Cwtsh, datblygwyd Clwb Cwtsh 2, cwrs hunan-astudio sy'n caniatáu i rieni a gofalwyr barhau i ddysgu'r Gymraeg, gan wneud hynny ar amser sy'n gyfleus.

Strategic objective 3

Use: helping learners to use the Welsh language in their communities and the workplace

Welsh at Home

The aim of the Welsh at Home programme is to provide more opportunities for parents, carers, and families to learn so they can speak Welsh with their children.

During 2021-2022, there were several new developments:

- ▶ Tutor placements have been set up in primary schools in Cardiff, Caerphilly and Aberystwyth, to provide Welsh at Home courses (tailored Entry-level courses) and confidence-boosting courses for parents and carers.
- ▶ In partnership with Mudiad Meithrin, 'Siarad Babi/Parentese' vocabulary was compiled - a special collection of vocabulary used with babies. Resources have been created based on this vocabulary, and they will be distributed through the Mudiad Meithrin networks.

- ▶ A new grant fund has been established to enable our providers to deliver Welsh at Home courses in their areas, in new and flexible ways.
- ▶ Following the success of Clwb Cwtsh, Clwb Cwtsh 2 was developed, which is a self-study course that enables parents and carers to continue to learn Welsh, and to do so at a convenient time.
- ▶ A library of resources was created for this audience, to support the transmission of Welsh at home.

A leaflet was published providing suggestions for books that are suitable for Welsh learners to read with their children.

Yn ystod 2021-2022, llwyddwyd i ddenu 102 o gyflogwyr newydd i fanteisio ar gynllun Cymraeg Gwaith - cynllun hyblyg, wedi'i ariannu'n llawn, i gryfhau sgiliau Cymraeg mewn gweithleoedd ledled y wlad. Nod y porth yw helpu ymarferwyr addysg i ddod o hyd i gwrs addas, yn sgil cyhoeddiad Llywodraeth Cymru y byddai cyrsiau Cymraeg ar gael am ddim i'r gweithlu addysg o fis Medi 2022 ymlaen.

Mae darpariaeth eang ar gael gan y Ganolfan Genedlaethol a'i phartneriaid: y Cynllun Sabothol Cenedlaethol; Consortia Addysg; ac Awdurdodau Lleol.

Mae hyn yn cynnwys:

- ▶ Dewis helaeth o gyrsiau cymunedol mewn dosbarthiadau wyneb-yn-wyneb a rhithiol. Mae'r rhain ar gael ar bum lefel dysgu.
- ▶ Cyrsiau'r Cynllun Sabothol Cenedlaethol, sef cyrsiau dwys ar bedair lefel sy'n cael eu darparu trwy amryw o fodolau gan Brifysgol Cymru Y Drindod Dewi Sant, Prifysgol Bangor a Phrifysgol Caerdydd.
- ▶ Cyrsiau hunan-astudio ar-lein, gan gynnwys cyrsiau byrion ar gyfer arweinwyr, athrawon a chynorthwywyr cynradd ac uwchradd, a chwrs lefel Mynediad ar gyfer dechreuwyr, sy'n gyfwerth â 120 awr yn y dosbarth.

Work Welsh

During 2021-2022, 102 new employers were attracted and were able to benefit from the Work Welsh scheme - a flexible, fully funded scheme, to improve Welsh language skills in workplaces across the country. This means more than 1,500 employers have participated in the scheme since its inception.

Over the past year, learners across all sectors benefited from self-study courses, intensive courses and confidence-building courses.

The sectoral courses continue to go from strength to strength, and effective partnerships have been created with the following sectors, including tutor placements and bespoke courses:

The Further Education / Higher Education sector

Local Authorities

Health

Early Years Care and Education

The education workforce

During the year, a new online portal was created that provides information about all the Welsh courses available for the education workforce.

The aim of the portal is to help education professionals find a suitable course, following the Welsh Government's announcement that Welsh language courses would be available free of charge for the education workforce from September 2022.

A wide range of provision is available from the National Centre and its partners: the National Sabbatical Scheme; Education Consortia; and Local Authorities.

This includes:

- ▶ A wide choice of community courses in face-to-face and virtual classes. These are available at five learning levels.
- ▶ The National Sabbatical Scheme's courses - intensive courses at four levels delivered through various models by the University of Wales Trinity Saint David, Bangor University and Cardiff University.
- ▶ Online self-study courses, including short courses for leaders, teachers and assistants in primary and secondary education, and an Entry level course for beginners, the equivalent of 120 classroom hours.

The National Centre has created a portal to help education professionals find a suitable course, following the Welsh Government's announcement that Welsh language courses would be available free of charge for the education workforce from September 2022.

Cyngor Celfyddydau Cymru

Mae'r bartneriaeth newydd rhwng y Ganolfan Genedlaethol a Chyngor Celfyddydau Cymru wedi arwain at benodi Cydlynnydd Dysgu Cymraeg gan y Cyngor.

Mae'r datblygiad yn adeiladu ar y cynllun peilot a gynhaliwyd yn ystod 2019-2020 i fesur y galw am hyfforddiant Cymraeg o fewn y celfyddydau, a dau gwrs Dysgu Cymraeg a gynhaliwyd yn Nant Gwrtheyrn ar gyfer gweithwyr llawrydd yn 2020-2021.

Bydd nawdd gan y Ganolfan Genedlaethol yn cyllido rôl y Cydlynnydd, fydd â chyfrifoldeb dros greu, cynnal a chydlynu gwasanaeth Dysgu Cymraeg newydd ar gyfer y sector gelfyddydol.

Duolingo

Mae cyfrifoldeb dros y cwrs Cymraeg poblogaidd ar Duolingo – sydd wedi denu bron dwy filiwn o ddysgwyr ledled y byd – wedi trosglwyddo i'r Ganolfan Genedlaethol.

Mae Adran Dysgu ac Addysgu'r Ganolfan wedi cymryd yr awenau oddi wrth y criw o wirfoddolwyr brwd frydig sy wedi cynnal y cwrs ers iddo gael ei lansio ar Duolingo ym mis Ionawr 2016.

Mae Duolingo yn defnyddio profiadau gemau cyfrifiadurol i helpu dysgwyr i ymarfer a chryfhau eu sgiliau iaith.

SaySomethinginWelsh

Ym Mehefin 2020 sefydlwyd partneriaeth rhwng SaySomethinginWelsh (SSIW) a'r Ganolfan, er mwyn ychwanegu at ddewis dysgwyr o adnoddau i gefnogi eu dysgu. Mae'r bartneriaeth yn caniatáu mynediad i ddysgwyr y Ganolfan at adnoddau SSIW. Mae defnyddio adnoddau SSIW yn ffordd dda o ymarfer ac adolygu yr hyn sy'n cael ei ddysgu ar y cyrsiau, ac yn cyfoethogi profiad y dysgwyr.

Yn ystod 2021-2022, mae 2,283 o ddysgwyr y Ganolfan wedi manteisio ar y cynnig yma i ddefnyddio adnoddau SSIW i gefnogi eu dysgu.

Arts Council of Wales

The new partnership between the National Centre and the Arts Council of Wales has resulted in the appointment of a Learn Welsh Coordinator by the Council.

The development builds on the pilot project undertaken in 2019-2020 to measure the demand for Welsh language training in the arts, and two Learn Welsh courses held at Nant Gwrtheyrn for freelance workers in 2020-2021.

Sponsorship from the National Centre will fund the Coordinator post, which will have responsibility for creating, providing and coordinating a new Learn Welsh service for the arts sector.

Duolingo

Responsibility for the popular Welsh course on Duolingo – which has attracted close to two million learners worldwide – has transferred to the National Centre.

The Centre's Teaching and Learning Department has been handed the reins from a group of enthusiastic volunteers who have supported the course since its launch on Duolingo in January 2016.

Duolingo makes use of computer gaming experiences to help learners practise and reinforce their language skills.

SaySomethinginWelsh

In June 2020, a partnership was established between SaySomethinginWelsh (SSIW) and the Centre, to add to the choice of resources available to learners to support their learning. The partnership enables the Centre's learners to access SSIW resources. Using SSIW resources is a good way to practise and revise the language learnt in the courses, and this enriches the learner experience.

In 2021-2022, 2,283 of the Centre's learners have taken advantage of this offer and have used SSIW resources to support their learning.

Addysg Oedolion Cymru

Mae cynyddu cyfleoedd i oedolion ddysgu Cymraeg a mwynhau cyrsiau trwy gyfrwng y Gymraeg wrth galon 'Memorandwm Cyd-dealltwriaeth' newydd rhwng Addysg Oedolion Cymru a'r Ganolfan Genedlaethol.

Bydd y cytundeb newydd yn annog a chefnogi staff a thiwtoriaid Addysg Oedolion Cymru i ddysgu Cymraeg fel rhan o'u datblygiad proffesiynol parhaus.

Adult Learning Wales

Increasing opportunities for adults to learn Welsh and to enjoy courses through the medium of Welsh is at the heart of a new 'Memorandum of Understanding' between Adult Learning Wales and the National Centre.

By working together, the aim is to spark interest in learning through the medium of Welsh, as well as signposting prospective learners to the wide range of Learn Welsh courses offered by the National Centre.

The new agreement will encourage and support staff and tutors at Adult Learning Wales to learn Welsh as part of their continuing professional development.

Adult Learning Wales are already offering 'WSOL' (Welsh for Speakers of Other Languages) courses for refugees and asylum seekers developed by the National Centre.

The 'Siarad' scheme

'Siarad' is a scheme that pairs new speakers with fluent speakers. Pairs are asked to spend 10 hours in each other's company. The aim is to give new speakers the opportunity to gain confidence and to be introduced to opportunities to use their Welsh.

There is a waiting list of learners who wish to be partnered, and the Centre will work with Menteriau Iaith Cymru on a new project named 'Gwirfoddoli a'r Gymraeg' (Volunteering and the Welsh Language) to attract more volunteers.

Supporting Learners

It has been a busy year in terms of activities to support learners to enjoy using their Welsh. These activities included:

► 'Ar Droed' Walks

16 walks were held in partnership with Mentrau Iaith Cymru, under the Mwynhau'r Gymraeg (Enjoying Welsh) brand.

► Amdani Reading Festival

The Amdani Reading Festival was held in early March. There were virtual sessions with authors, and the Centre published guidance for parents.

► Celebrating learners on the radio

BBC Radio Cymru held a Week of Celebrating Learning Welsh in October 2021. New speakers' voices were heard on Radio Cymru programmes, from the religious service to Shân Cothi's programme and Dros Frecwast. A virtual session was also held to enable our learners to get to know some of the presenters.

► Short plays

Following on from the success of 'Enfys', a micro play jointly produced by BBC Cymru Fyw and Theatr Genedlaethol Cymru during the first lockdown, a new series of short plays were created.

► Glan-llyn residential course

The residential course at the Urdd centre in Glan-llyn, near Bala, was an opportunity for many of our learners to return to face-to-face classes, and for others, this was their first experience of learning in a class with fellow-learners.

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


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
